

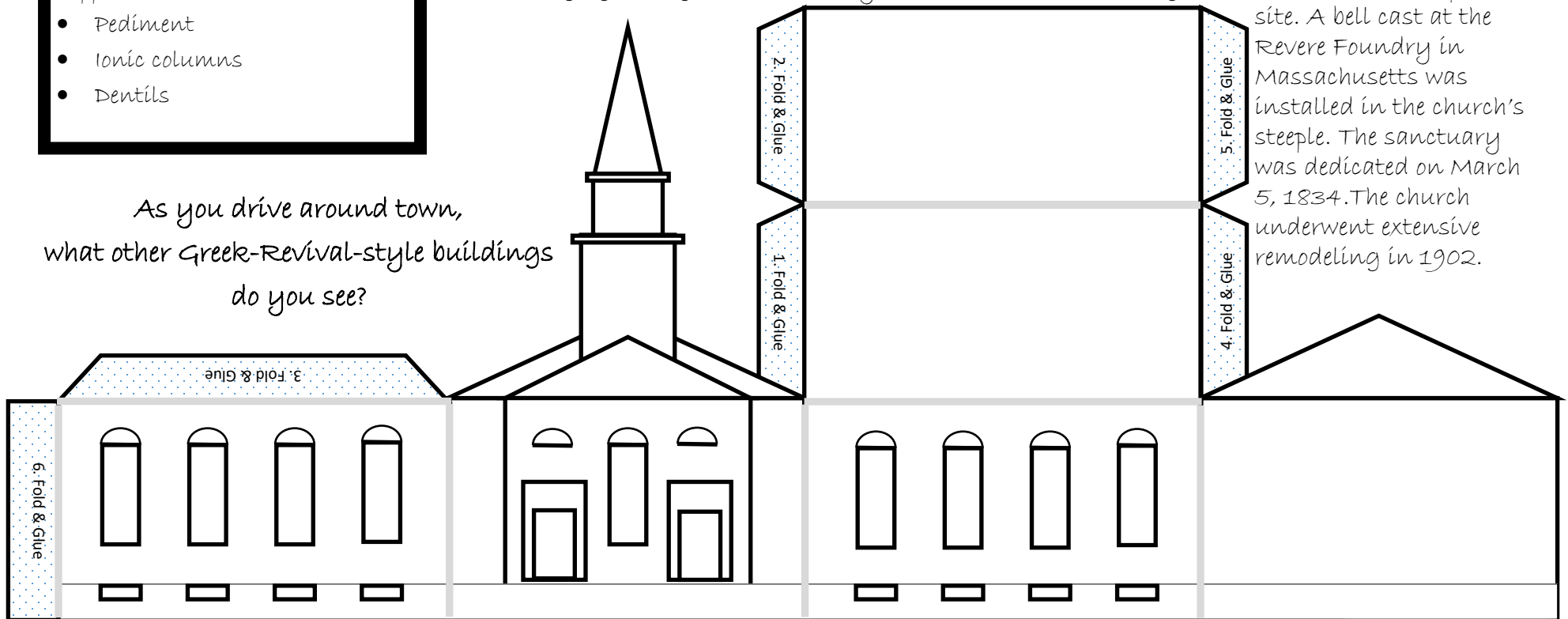
First Congregational Church of Searsport (Easy)

Greek Revival Architecture (approx. 1820s-1860s)

- Pediment
- Ionic columns
- Dentils

The Congregational Society in Searsport gathered on October 4, 1815 with sixteen members including 14 women and a minister. As the center of the community life moved into the village, and the congregation grew, the Society built their second building on Townhouse Hill, the present site. A bell cast at the Revere Foundry in Massachusetts was installed in the church's steeple. The sanctuary was dedicated on March 5, 1834. The church underwent extensive remodeling in 1902.
